I Maria K. Whistling of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, being of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, do make and publish this,

my last will and testament in manner and form, following, that is to say, After my debts and funeral charges are paid, I devise and bequeath as follows:

1 Item I give and bequeath to the Managers of Mount Olivet Cemetery of Frederick County, Maryland, the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.) in trust, that the said Managers shall invest the same and apply the interest, or income arising therefrom toward keeping in good repair, and condition my Lots, graves and Monuments in said Cemetery, said Lots being that known as Lot 16 and which stands in the name of E. H. Rockwell.

2 Item I give, devise, and bequeath unto the "Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America," incorporated April 12, 1862, by act of Legislature of the State of New York, the sum of Thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to be expended for the appropriate objects of said Corporation, to be paid eighteen months after my decease.

3 Item I bequeath to my executor the sum of Thirty thousand (\$30,000.) dollars, in trust, to pay over the same, in eighteen months after my decease, to the person who, when the same is payable, shall act as Treasurer of the Congregational Home Missionary Society, formed in the city of New York, in the year eighteen hundred and twenty six, to be applied to the charitable use and purposes of said Society, and under its direction.

4 Item I give and bequeath to the "American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions" incorporated in Massachusetts in 1812, the sum of Five thousand dollars (\$5,000) this legacy to be paid by my executor hereinafter named within eighteen months after my decease.

4. Item I give and bequeath to "The American Tract Society" instituted in the City of New York, May, 1825, the sum of Five thousand (\$5,000) dollars to be applied to the charitable uses and purposes of said Society, this legacy to be paid over by my executor herein after named within eighteen months after my decease.

5. Item I give and bequeath to my Cousin Mrs. Emily Jane Anders of Frederick County the sum of Five hundred dollars (\$500)

6. Item I give and bequeath to my Cousins, Rev. Samuel A. Callender at present residing at Mechanicsburg Pa. and his three Sisters Maria Callender, Elizabeth Callender, Mrs. Ellen H. Laffer, and their heirs, the sum of Six thousand dollars (\$6,000) to be divided between them, Share and Share alike.

7. Item I give and bequeath to my Cousin Annie M. Whistling of Mont. Alto, Franklin Co. Penn. and her heirs the sum of Five thousand dollars (\$5,000)

8. Item I give and bequeath to my Cousin Ellen S. Whistling of Mont Alto Franklin Co. Penn. and her heirs the sum of Five thousand dollars (\$5,000)

9. Item I give and bequeath to my Cousin Edward B. Whistling of Mont Alto, Franklin Co. Penn. and his heirs the sum of Fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500)

10. Item I give and bequeath to my Cousin Adeline Loose wife of the Rev. J. Loose of Virginia and her heirs the sum of One thousand dollars (\$1,000)

11. Item I give and bequeath to my Cousin Eveline R. Whistling of Middletown Penn. and her heirs the sum of Fifteen hundred dollars, (\$1,500)

12. Item I give and bequeath to my Cousin Frank C. Norwood of Frederick County the sum of Fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500)

13. Item I give and bequeath to Anna Mary Smith, who now lives with me, the sum of Five hundred dollars (\$500), the furniture in the front Chamber, the green Carpet, in the north room below stairs, for the purpose of procuring admissions into The Home for the Aged of Frederick City, and to provide for her necessary outfit &c, for admissions thereto, upon Conditions that she remains with me as at present, as long as I live: Provided, however, if she should die before my death, or if for any reason she leave me before I die, then this bequest shall be void and of no effect.

14. Item It is my will, and I do hereby direct, that the foregoing legacies shall be paid out of my personal estate, and not out of the real estate of which I die seized and possessed, and that said real estate shall be entirely free from, and unincumbered by the payment of said legacies: nor shall said legacies be in any manner chargeable upon said real estate, even though it should happen, that my said personal estate should not be sufficient to pay out said legacies in full.

15. Item I give, devise and bequeath to my Cousin Frank C. Norwood, his heirs, and assigns forever, all that my house and lot wherein I now reside situate and lying at the west end of West Third Street in Frederick City Frederick County Maryland, which was conveyed to me by, Elisha H. Rockwell by a deed bearing date September 1st. A. D. 1881, and recorded in Liber A. R. No 7. folio 573, one of the Land Record of Frederick County, as by reference thereto will fully appear - And I declare that if any devise of real estate contained in this my will, shall fail or be incapable of taking effect, for any cause whatsoever, the real estate or interest therein comprised in such devise,

shall be included in residuary clause contain in my will

16 Item I give and bequeath all my household, and kitchen furniture, bed clothing, table linen, and wearing apparel, that I may have at my decease to Anna M. Wiestling, Ellen S. Wiestling, Frank C. Norwood, Anna C. Kies, Maria Callender, Elizabeth Callender.

17 Item I give, devise and bequeath to my Cousin Frank C. Norwood all the rest and residue of my property, and estate, real, personal, and mixed, of every kind and description whatsoever.

18 Item It is my will, and I do hereby direct that all collateral inheritance taxes, and all other expenses incident to the settlement of my estate shall be paid out of the residuum, so that all the pecuniary legacies above mentioned may be paid in full. And I do hereby authorize, and empower my Executor hereinafter named, to sell to the best advantage such of my property and estate, real and personal, as in his judgment may be necessary to pay said taxes, and expenses incident to the settlement of my estate, and to pay the said pecuniary legacies mentioned in my will -

19 Item And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my said Cousin Frank C. Norwood of Frederick County, Maryland, to be sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament; revoking and annulling all former wills by me heretofore made ratifying and confirming this and none other to be my last Will and Testament.

Codicil to the foregoing Will.
